

### **Alan D. Woolf, MD, MPH**

Dr. Woolf is President of the American Association of Poison Control Centers. He is Associate Professor in Pediatrics, Harvard Medical School; Co-Director, Pediatric Environmental Health Center, Children's Hospital of Boston; Adjunct Associate Professor of Toxicology, Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and allied Health Sciences; and Core Faculty Member, New England Injury Prevention Research Center. For many years, Dr. Woolf served as Director of the Massachusetts Poison Center (later the Regional Poison Control Center Serving Massachusetts and Rhode Island).

Dr. Woolf has authored an extensive list of publications dealing with pediatrics and toxicology. He has experience in direct patient care, teaching, research, and administration.

Dr. Woolf earned his medical degree at the University of Chicago and masters of public health degree at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is board-certified in internal medicine, pediatrics, and medical toxicology.
